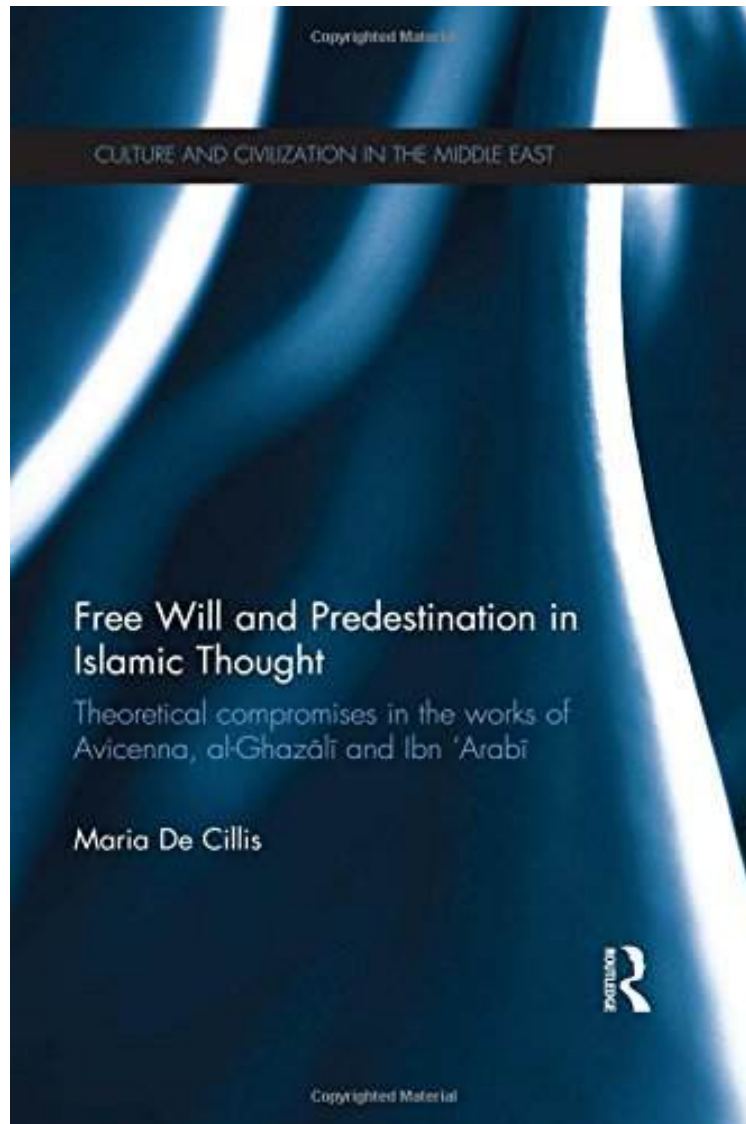

The subject of human free will versus divine predestination is one of the most contentious topics in classical Islamic thought. By focusing on a theme of central importance to any philosophy of religion and to Islam in particular, this book offers a critical study of the intellectual contributions offered to this discourse by three key medieval Islamic thinkers: Avicenna, al-Ghazali, and Ibn Arabi. Through investigation of primary sources, I think that some of the important ideas that the author presents might provide a useful basis for further investigation of the relation between Ibn Arabi's theosophy and the philosophical thought of Ibn Sina.
